



Benediction

Pastor Andrew's Message

Psalm 23 is perhaps the most well-known Psalm of them all, written by King David, who was a shepherd boy in his youth. My title for today is 'The Shepherd is on the Throne' since this Psalm uses the well-known image of shepherd but also the image of a King. We will see that the divine shepherd supplies every need (v1), gives rest to the weary (v2), prepares the soul for heavenly service (v3), and is with us in the darkest times (v4). In the final two verses the image changes to Kingship and we see that a banquet is provided in the middle of conflict (v5) and it will satisfy all the needs of a lifetime and beyond (v6). Spurgeon comments 'no man has a right to consider himself the Lord's sheep unless his nature is renewed, for the scriptural description of an unconverted man does not picture them as sheep but as wolves or goats...it is well to know, as David certainly did, that we belong to the Lord.'

Your generosity and prayers are helping to transform the lives of people like Olastique.

Olastique lives in Soubré in Côte d'Ivoire. She's a member of a local church, where she took part in Tearfund's Transforming Communities training, and she tells us her story of how her situation has been transformed!

Made from fermented cassava flour, attiéké (pronounced atchekay) has a couscous-type texture and is most often eaten with grilled fish or meat and a spicy pepper sauce. It's an affordable dish, and more importantly for Olastique, it's a dish that's allowing her to afford the things she needs.

'I was working in the attiéké trade. However, I wasn't earning enough to meet my own needs or those of my family. After the Integral Mission training, one of the things that I understood really clearly was that perseverance and a clear vision are essential for success.
